To whom it may concern:



STRUCTION OF IMPROVE-
MENTS TO THE VILLAGE OWN-
ED AND OPERATED SEWER
SYSTEM IN THE VILLAGE,
STATING THE ESTIMATED
MAXIMUM COST THEREOF, IS
\$775,000, APPROPRIATING SAID
AMOUNT THEREFOR, AUTHORIZ-
ING THE ISSUANCE OF \$775,000
SERIAL BONDS TO FINANCE
SAID APPROPRIATION, AND
AUTHORIZING ANY AMOUNTS
RECEIVED FROM THE UNITED
STATES OF AMERICA AND/OR
THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO
BE EXPENDED TOWARDS THE

WHEREAS, the Village of Boon-
ville (herein called "Village"), in
the County of Oneida, New York, is
required by the Order of the Com-
missioner of Health of the State of
New York, dated March 7, 1968,
as modified, promulgated pursuant
to Article 12 of the Public Health
Law, constituting Chapter 45 of the
Consolidated Laws of the State of
New York, to cease and abate by
April 1, 1968, discharging sewage
or industrial wastes or other wastes
or the effluent therefrom into the
waters of the State (namely, Mill
Creek), in contravention of stand-
ards duly adopted and assigned to
such receiving waters unless by
September 1, 1969 construction has
commenced to provide sewage treat-
ment facilities as may be necessary
to prevent such pollution of the
waters of the State; and

Interior, pursuant to the provisions
of 33 USCA 466 et seq., or from
such other agency as is determined,

of the Laws of 1965 and Section
1263-b of the Public Health Law, a
grant of State funds, to aid in
financing the cost of constructing
sewer facilities to intercept, treat
and dispose of all sewage dis-
