

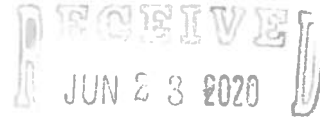

RE: Brandy Brook Camp structures

Dear Mr. Howe:

DEC staff conducted a site visit to the Brandy Brook Camp on May 21, 2020 to meet with Brian Roat and several Brandy Brook Club members to answer questions about moving forward with work required as part of the conservation easement modification. Proposals put forth at that meeting included the ability to replace the existing woodshed, which is in very poor condition. The replacement structure, which would remain as part of the easement modification terms, would be the same size and in the same location as the existing structure. Another proposal is to relocate the existing privy to a location adjacent to the woodshed and placing it over a concrete containment vault. The easement modification terms require either moving the privy to a location outside of any wetland buffer or placing it over a containment vault. Both of those requirements would be met at this location.

By way of this letter the Department is acknowledging that both proposals would be acceptable as they would meet the terms of the proposed conservation easement modification. Our approval is contingent on all work necessary to remove the existing cooler truck body and associated items be accomplished at the same time the woodshed replacement and privy relocation are done.
